Working together	<ul> <li>Interaction and cooperation between members outside their local area – boundaries are a hindrance</li> </ul>	x 4
Recruitment & training	<ul> <li>Recruitment</li> <li>Retention</li> <li>Retention of young ringers</li> <li>Ability to encourage recruits in a younger age range</li> </ul>	x 5 x 3
	<ul> <li>PR / web presence</li> <li>Training</li> <li>No Ringing Centre</li> <li>Education &amp; training is failing outside a few miles of the Ringing Centre</li> </ul>	



Meetings/ practices	<ul> <li>Guild meetings/events are badly attended</li> <li>Guild general meeting</li> <li>Guild meetings - the standard of ringing is now poor - not worth taking good inexperienced people</li> <li>Still using meeting structures that were in use generations ago!</li> <li>I2-bell practices</li> </ul>	x 2
Other	<ul> <li>Involving young ringers in all areas and activities of the guild</li> <li>Getting people to stand for office</li> <li>Society can sometimes be like a retirement club</li> <li>Resistance from older (especially) members/ringers to change</li> <li>Acceptance of ringers' limitations</li> <li>Suspicion of change</li> <li>Most things!</li> </ul>	x 2

## D. What are the cross-boundary opportunities in your region?

Working together	<ul> <li>The Four Shires Guild exists as an umbrella organisation in the North Cotswolds (Glos, Oxon, Warks &amp; Worcs). It does this very well indeed in this very complex, rural area</li> </ul>	
Training and development	<ul> <li>Lots of joint practices (including 12-bell) and training events</li> <li>Crossing guild boundaries for helping on training days</li> <li>Better simulator technology</li> <li>Learn from the Birmingham School of Ringing</li> <li>Make ringing centres available to neighbouring associations/ guilds</li> </ul>	x 2
Other	Chance to create new bands that can ring the 'fundamentals'

- Group opinion is that regionalisation in a formal sense is not a good idea, but the group is happy to continue discussion on a regular basis possibly in Facebook.
- Image of ringing has to be improved
- Suggested regional groups may be wrong and could be better grouped
- Give the Central Council **real** power to manage and run
- Make guilds/associations report to and take lead from the Central Council which genuinely leads
- Raise personal membership to about £50pa each to make a **real** member organisation
- Create a national record system for all ringers and communicate with them
