The Revd. Pitt EYKYN (1853 - 1912)

An Honorary Member of the Central Council from 1891-1894, he attended 1 meeting

Pitt Eykyn was born on 29th September 1853 in the St. Pancras area of London.

He studied at Chichester Theological College and was ordained Deacon at Gloucester Cathedral on 21st December 1877.

Before his ordination he was assisting the Revd. H.T. Ellacombe with the preparation of detail for his book on the bells of Somerset 1870-1872.

At different times he was curate of St, Luke, Glasgow, and at Stonehouse in Gloucestershire. In 1881 he was Rector of France Lynch. At one time he was Vicar of Magor with Redwick in Monmouthshire. A bell cast for Magor in 1886 bears his name as Vicar.

He was re-elected Secretary of the Gloucester & Bristol Diocesan Association on June 20th 1881, but in September 1895 he resigned both his living at St Augustine's Bristol and also his position as Secretary of the Gloucester and Bristol Diocesan Association, owing to ill health. After serving curacies in a number of parishes in 1906 he became chaplain (with Additional Clergy Society) at Parel diocese Bombay, India.

He died, in Bombay, on July 14th 1912.
