Integrated Teacher Training Scheme

The Ringing Foundation recently held two one-day seminars, in London and Birmingham, on the theme of 'moving forward' in the training of ringers generally, and working with young people in particular.



One of the speakers was Pip Penney from South Wales, and a member of the CCCBR Education Committee. She introduced a proposed Integrated Teacher Training Scheme, which is currently being piloted in South Wales.

The scheme is aimed at

encouraging new people to take up training covering all the stages to Plain Bob Minor and there are currently twelve new instructors undergoing an initial introductory theory course, followed by a period of twelve months of mentoring by 'Experienced Teachers' as the new instructors teach their first pupils. There is also a new teachers pack, a learners pack of course materials and a mentor's pack. If the pilot scheme is successful, the aim is to roll it out nationally. This will rely on having a pool of 'Experienced Teachers' to help deliver the scheme. It is important that the 'Experienced Teachers' have been trained to run the scheme and the Ringing Centres Committee is looking to run a course next summer aimed at Ringing Centres who may wish to run further pilots or deliver the Training Scheme in their area.

Ecclesfield Ringing Centre, Sheffield



Ecclesfield became a Recognised Ringing Centre in August 2009. The Ringing Centre is committed to teaching ringers from other towers and keeping bells ringing in towers that are short of ringers. Ecclesfield has:

- A reasonably accessible, spacious comfortable ringing chamber with good heating, ventilation, seating and lighting.
- A 15cwt ring of 8 bells that are not difficult to handle and have short draft ropes.
- A computer based 8 bell ringing simulator.
- CCTV so that movements of the bells can be observed from the ringing chamber.
- Room in the bell chamber to safely observe bells being rung.

Practice night is on Tuesday (19.30). There are also regular simulator sessions usually on Friday evening (19.30). A chance for ringers to improve their bell handling and receive tuition in mastering methods and striking skills.

Quarter peals arranged to fulfill the needs or demands of individuals or teams, usually on open bells on Sunday evening or on the simulator at other times. We help arrange quarters at other towers.

Activities are run in conjunction with the Ecclesfield Church Bell Ringers and include outings, tower open days, service ringing, steeple keeping and social activities.
