Richard Mills, when Master of the Society (1837 to 1839), offered the medallion to encourage peal ringing. Presented to members of the bands who rang in subsequent peals of Treble Bob Major, Royal and Maximus.

Three existing copies have been adopted as badges of office for the Immediate Past Master, Senior Steward and Junior Steward of the Society.

Designed by Roy Rice of Banwell, Somerset and manufactured by Marples & Beasley who, on ceasing trading, lost the dies. Records show that 36 silver, 2 gold plated and 2 bronze copies were made, a total of 40 examples overall.




