THE BADGE OF THE CRAFT (J COMBER)

J Comber, a jeweller from Woking in Surrey, advertised a ringers' pendant in gold, silver or bronze. The first advertisement first appeared in the Ringing World on the 5th September 1913 and ran until 18th February 1927, the only change being in the prices. It was only ever offered as a pendant.
