'A motion was passed that inquiries be made regarding design and cost of a membership badge, the matter to be brought before the next annual meeting.' *'The Ringing World' 27.vi.1952 p411*

'The Association badge was next considered. Miss Jacqueline Evans submitted three designs she had received from the makers. One, a bell in blue enamel with the name of the Association in silver lettering inscribed on it, was chosen. It was decided to purchase 100 studs and 50 brooches.' *'The Ringing World' 17.iv.1953 p250*

'Association badges were on sale.' *'The Ringing World' 25.ix.1953 p360*

'Badge patterns were displayed, having been submitted by Miss Anne Tippins, of Abergavenny and Miss Sheila Salkeld, of Chepstow.' *'The Ringing World'* 5.xi.1965 p746

'During recent years some discussion has been held with a view to changing the design of the Association's badge, the existing design being considered too large .It was decided to accept the design of prepared by Miss Sheila Salkeld, of Chepstow, and that an order should be placed as soon as possible.' *'The Ringing World'* 29.iv.1966 p277

'The new badges were proving very popular.' *'The Ringing World'* 21.iv.1967 p267
