

NORTHAMPTONSHIRE STEDMAN DOUBLES PEAL BAND



The peal band originated through a suggestion by David Garton to Peter Fleckney that peals of Stedman Doubles might be rung on all the pealable five bell towers in Northamptonshire. The first peal took place at Barton Seagrave. The band expanded to the extent that two or three peals were being rung simultaneously at times. Key members of the band subsequently moved away and the peal attempts came to an end.

The square design incorporates an outer rope design that replicates the 'slow work' and 'quick work' of the method. The badges are made of silver, with a width of 29mm, and were made by W O Lewis of Birmingham.
