

INDEX 1840-1845

This is essentially an index of places and subjects, although a few names of importance appear. Generally, if there is more than one place which has a particular name, then this is qualified by the addition of the county in which it is situated: if there is more than one ring of bells in a place, this is qualified by the dedication of the church. Modern terminology is used, so that, for example, Grandsire Bob Triples has been indexed as Plain Bob Triples, and Union Treble Bob is indexed as Oxford Treble Bob. The index as constructed is hierarchical, that is, a dash refers to the heading above. Thus for, instance, in the pair of entries

the second line would refer to Almondbury band (of ringers).

Because of the substantial appendices, the period 1840-1845 is covered by pages 1-272 (including a few reports found too late to be included in their proper places), the period up to 1799 covered by pages 273- 284, the period 1800-1829 by pages 285-332, and the period 1830-1839 by pages 333-362.
