
DUBLIN, ST GEORGE

Problems with the structure of St George's church, Dublin led to its closure in the early 1990s. The building became a theatre, the first of several new uses, and the bells, after ten years in store, found a new home in the city at Christ Church, Taney. St George's Society of Amateur Change Ringers held its 113th and final AGM on 15th January 1990.

The ringers decided to use the belfry funds to produce a badge for former ringers at the tower.

The badge is 48 x 24mm and made of 9 carat gold. The small hallmarks are 375, 9K and Britannia for the Dublin assay office. The larger stamps are 9^{CT} and T O'R
