

## **Safeguarding Principles**

- RECORD ALL ACTIONS and store securely
- Remember the safety and welfare of any child or adult takes precedence over all other concerns. This includes confidentiality and personal loyalties
- Consider the support needs of all who might be affected by allegations of abuse including you
- It is essential that all Tower Captains know who their Parish Safeguarding Officer is and understand the SGO role and responsibilities
- Guild/Association Safeguarding Leads are encouraged to nurture a relationship with their Diocesan Safeguarding Advisors. The DSA will be able to give advice and support in the event of a concern/allegation relating to a situation in a non-church environment.
