
The programme affords lots of opportunities for ringing, business, informal gatherings and forging new ways of working together.



PARKING

FRIDAY EVENING

St Petrock's - there is no very close parking and no lay-bys for picking-up, dropping-off. There are many City Centre car parks charging £4.50 for the first 2 hours. St Petrock's is approx. 15 minutes walk from St David's, see below.

St David's and The Imperial

There is a small car park next to the The Imperial (free after 8pm), and limited street parking in New North Road between St David's and The Imperial (free after 6pm). There is also a small car park near St David's, in Bystock Terrace / Queens Terrace EX4 4HY, £3.40 for 2 hours, free after 6pm.

SATURDAY

Attendees may use the West Exe School Car park whilst attending the meetings (no overnight parking). Access is via Cowick Lane to Hatherleigh Road EX2 9JU. Note that there is no vehicular access if accessing Hatherleigh Road direct from Alphington Road.

SATURDAY EVENING

For those attending the **Social**, the nearest car park is Haven Banks car park, off Michael Browning Way via Haven Road EX2 8DP, a five minute walk, free after 6pm.

N.B. If you park in the nearby Havens Bank Retail Park, off Water Lane, parking is chargeable all day!

SUNDAY

There is no parking at **Exeter Community Centre**. Street parking restrictions are in force every day. Please use City Centre car parks.

FOOD and DRINK


