





ABOUT THE TALKS

Ringing 2030 - a Yorkshire Association perspective

In this talk, professor Andrew Slade, Yorkshire Association of Change Ringers (YACR) President will give an overview of the membership and activities of the YACR in relation to the challenges high lighted in the Council's '2030' initiative.

The composition of the YACR has changed significantly over the last few decades and Andrew will demonstrate how the membership of the YACR has fluctuated in both number and age distribution



over that period. Covering three CofE Dioceses brings some challenges of its own but the main issues are very like that of other large, dispersed and mainly rural Guilds or Associations.

Andrew will brief the meeting on both these challenges and also on the way in which the YACR is meeting them.

"We've always done it like that!" Transforming your Guild or Association: from the Past to a Sustainable Future

Since 2021, the Bedfordshire Association (BACBR) has been undergoing review and restructuring, the final stages of which were implemented at the Association's AGM in May 2025. Over this period, the objects of the Association have been updated, the rules revised, a new management structure put in place, the Districts dissolved, and a redesigned calendar of events introduced. In this presentation, President of the BACBR, Linda Garton, will describe in more detail the changes which have taken place and why they were needed, explain how the process of restructuring evolved and the barriers which had to be



overcome, and evaluate the success (or otherwise!) of the restructuring so far! What will be clear is that there is no magic wand and no easy solutions to the issues faced by ringing in many areas, but it is hoped that this session might provide a few ideas to help towards a more sustainable future in your guild or association. There will be an opportunity for questions and answers at the end.

Using Social Media as a Recruiting Tool (Practical Workshop)



This is an interactive workshop where you will create a media page which you can use to promote ringing in your tower to the wider community. There will be a walkthrough demonstration of creating a social media page and discussions on how you can increase your following through social media. There will also be a chance to have a look at using the new Ringing 2030 branding and customising/using this for online posting. For this workshop, ideally you will need a laptop/tablet device, but a mobile phone will work fine.

What can martial arts teach us about leadership?

Tina Stoecklin is the current President of the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, another step in a ringing journey that started with a lecture on the mathematics of change ringing at Kalamazoo College. She has held several roles and offices including Editor of The Ringing World, Publicity Officer for the North American Guild, Secretary of the Scottish Association, and ringing master for both Glasgow Cathedral and Inveraray bell towers. She has been a member of ART since 2013



and is part of the training team at Glasgow Cathedral. She has run a bellringing after school club, co-written two books on handbell ringing, and was part of the Women in Ringing Working Group which benchmarked the lack of women in leadership roles in ringing and collected stories about the experiences of women ringers. Outside of ringing, Tina has a successful career as technical project manager, and currently works in delivering software platforms for the Scottish Government. And a bit of karate on the side.

Ringers ... a scandal to the Church, and a disgrace to themselves




Would you have fallen foul of the nineteenth century belfry reformers because you were often drunk, rang for entertainment on Sundays and failed to attend church, or frittered your ringing earnings away on gambling?

A small group of nineteenth-century clergymen, including the Revd HT Ellacombe of chiming apparatus fame, saw it as their mission to reform bellringers and bellringing. But were bellringers really that badly behaved? And did the 'belfry reform' movement lead to

as much change as is sometimes claimed?

Gareth Davies's latest research project comes out of his work on Foolish Youths and Substantial Rewards, his 2024 book exploring the balance between ringing for profit and ringing for pleasure in Cambridge. He is now investigating what people thought of ringers nationwide, and how and why attitudes to them changed in the nineteenth century. The research has a long way to go, so Gareth will be explaining a little about belfry reform, identifying some of the puzzles it throws up, and sharing some of his theories and early findings.
