How are we doing it?

- Approach to projects has been re-assessed due to struggling to secure committed volunteers
- Small core team established
- Project remits agreed
- 3 student "Summer Honorariums" appointed to support website build, content creation and school lesson plans
- Roles funded by a bequest aimed at supporting Ringing 2030
- Pace of progress has significantly increased



Two new societies have joined the University Ringing network this term — welcome aboard!




University Ringing

Under 18s

- Feedback from youth leaders and parents that a website akin to University Ringing would be helpful for under 18s
- It will include information for new and existing ringers and parents / carers
- Profiles of youth teams to be included and maintained
- Working with Derbyshire scouts and ringers to create a blueprint that could be used across all youth groups, including a potential aligned CCBR sponsored ringing badge scheme

The Coventry Spires are a group of enthusiastic young ringers, parents and helpers who meet on the 2nd Sunday of every month from 14.30 until 16.30. We have a good mix of ages in the group and focus on helping the group progress their ringing repertoire and striking as a team, as well as enjoying social time and snacks together!

We aim to enter a team <u>in to</u> the Ringing World National Youth Competition (RWNYC) each year, which is a wonderful opportunity to meet young ringers from across the country and ring on some interesting bells. We also take part in local ringing activities and enter a team in the Guild 8 bell competition.

A Midlands group of young ringers from Coventry Spires, Worcestershire, Oxfordshire, Leicestershire, Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire and St Martins Guild (the <u>Brundingers</u>) has been established. This group meets quarterly for tours, courses and a Midlands competition in the Spring as a <u>warm up</u> event for the RWNYC. <u>Plus</u> socialising and cake!





School lesson plans

- PR tool to raise awareness of ringing in schools, by aligning ringing to the national curriculum across all subject areas
- Primary plans have been drafted and require work to review, trial, finalise, market and roll out
- Gap analysis and curriculum cross check underway
- Currently running the Science plan through the development process
- Seeking primary / science teachers to review the content and trial the plan
- PowerPoint teaching resources being designed, aimed at being delivered by non ringing teachers

Ringing networks

- Objective is to close the gaps between the various youth ringing organisations and create clear pathways for young ringers, wherever they are
- Positive response to consultation on indicative ringing networks proposal in the spring
- Regional structure to be created, which includes all young ringers up to age 30 with supporting comms networks
- The Young Ringers Hub will provide the information and guidance to support this
- Project to be launched in 2026; support will be needed

 - Tower visit guidance, taster sessions and pathways into towers / teaching hubs
 - Links to useful information elsewhere e.g. Safeguarding, Mobile Belfries Trust
 - Summer schools, after school clubs

 - How to start / run a youth team

Plans for the rest of 2025

- Updating of university society information
- Launch University Ringing, followed by the Young Ringers Hub
- Customised branding to be applied to websites and school lesson plans
- Trialling of Primary Science lesson plan in schools and completion of remaining plans
- Creation of blueprint for school lesson plan roll out and marketing strategy – help needed!
- Create resources for leaders
- Content collaboration with the Ringing World





Plans for 2026

- Continuous improvement of the Young Ringers Hub
- Prioritised incremental roll out of Primary school lessons plans with supporting marketing strategy
- Explore viability of Secondary lesson plans
- Development of Derbyshire scouting national blueprint for youth groups and supporting CCCBR sponsored badge scheme
- Create ringing networks to support and sustain youth ringing
- Seek funding for our plans via the Heritage Lottery Fund bid
- Further collaboration with the Ringing World
- Set up teams to own and maintain the resources
